



What will be my clinical experience as a PGY2 under new National Framework for Prevocational Medical Training?

Currently the CRMEC accredits PGY2 training places in the ACT region against the CRMEC Standards. From 2024, the PGY2 training program in the ACT region will be accredited against the new national standards and the requirements introduced in the new National Framework. The fundamental requirements for PGY2 training are very similar to the current program in the ACT. From 2024:



From 2024, as a PGY2 you will complete 4 training terms (12-14 weeks each) that will include **at least one term each of undifferentiated illness care, chronic illness care and acute illness care**. In the new structure, there is more flexibility for terms in a range of different clinical experiences, including opportunities for non-clinical experience (e.g., Population Health). You will have one additional term that will cover one of the following clinical areas:
